Topic: Sleep related movement disorders commonly encountered in patients with mental illnesses - clinical epidemiology & implications

Abstract: Sleep related movement is one of the common sleep symptoms and it could be encountered in patients from young age to elderly. While some of these sleep movements bring concerns to family, some can potentially cause sleep disturbances and injuries. They could also be signs of more serious problems such as neurodegeneration. In clinical psychiatric practice, a good history taking and assessment is important in recognizing and differentiating various types of sleep related movements and the different diagnoses. In this lecture, a variety of sleep related movement problems would be illustrated from epidemiological to management aspects, and its clinical implication on our daily psychiatric practice.
